AGREED ORDER OF VOLUNTARY SURRENDER

On the 28 day of August, 2015, came on to be heard before the Texas Medical Board (the Board), duly in session, the matter of the license of Francisco Basil Saucedo, M.D. (Respondent).

On June 12, 2014, came to be heard before the Disciplinary Panel (the "Panel") of the Texas Medical Board (the "Board"), composed of Carlos Gallardo, Chair, Allan Shulkin, M.D., and Frank Denton, members of the Board duly in session, the matter of the Application for Temporary Suspension or Restriction with Notice of the license of Francisco Basil Saucedo, M.D. ("Respondent"). Lee Bukstein represented Board staff. The Panel entered an Order Granting Temporary Suspension (2014 Order) on that date.

With the consent of Respondent, the Board makes the following Findings and Conclusions of Law and enters this Agreed Order of Voluntary Surrender.

FINDINGS

The Board finds that:

1. Respondent received all notice required by law. All jurisdictional requirements have been satisfied. Respondent waives any defect in notice and any further right to notice or hearing under the Medical Practice Act, Title 3, Subtitle B, Texas Occupations Code (the Act) or the Rules of the Board.
2. Respondent currently holds Texas Medical License No. H-8375. Respondent was originally issued this license to practice medicine in Texas on December 4, 1990.
3. Respondent is primarily engaged in general practice. Respondent is not board certified by a member board of the American Board of Medical Specialties.
4. Respondent is 54 years of age.

5. Board Staff has filed a Complaint at the State Office of Administrative Hearings based on the allegations considered for the 2014 Order. An investigation is ongoing regarding additional allegations of violations of the provisions of previous Board orders.

6. At this time, Respondent wishes to cease the practice of medicine due to a medical condition and treatment which makes it difficult for him to practice medicine.

7. By Respondent's signature on this Agreed Order, Respondent requests that the voluntary surrender of his Texas Medical License be accepted and that the voluntary surrender of her Texas Medical License be effective on the date of the entry of this Agreed Order.

8. Respondent agrees to the entry of this Agreed Order and to comply with its terms and conditions.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the above Findings, the Board concludes that:

1. The Board has jurisdiction over the subject matter and Respondent pursuant to the Act.

2. Section 164.061 of the Act and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE 196.1 and 196.2 authorize the Board to accept the voluntary surrender of Respondent's Texas Medical License.

3. This Order is based on Finding No. 5 and 6 and the specific authority of Sections 164.051(a)(3) and 164.052(a)(5) of the Act.

4. Section 164.002(a) of the Act authorizes the Board to resolve and make a disposition of this matter through an Agreed Order.

ORDER

Based on the above Findings and Conclusions of Law, the Board ORDERS that:

1. The voluntary surrender of Respondent's Texas Medical License should be, and is, accepted by the Board effective on the date this Order is signed by the President of the Board.

2. Respondent's Texas Medical License H-8375 is, therefore, canceled.

3. Respondent shall immediately cease practice in Texas. Respondent's practice in the state of Texas after the date of entry of this Agreed Order shall constitute a violation of this Order, subjecting Respondent to disciplinary action by the Board or prosecution for practicing without a license in Texas.

4. By this voluntary surrender of Respondent's Texas Medical License, Respondent resolves any and all complaints currently before the Board.

5. Respondent may not apply for a reinstatement of his license until at least one year after the date of the entry of this order. If, after the passage of the one-year period, Respondent wishes to seek reinstatement of his license, Respondent may file an application for license reinstatement only once every 12 months thereafter.

RESPONDENT WAIVES ANY FURTHER HEARINGS OR APPEALS TO THE BOARD OR TO ANY COURT IN REGARD TO ALL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THIS AGREED ORDER. RESPONDENT AGREES THAT THIS IS A FINAL ORDER.

THIS ORDER IS A PUBLIC RECORD.

I, FRANCISCO BASIL SAUCEDA, M.D., HAVE READ AND UNDERSTAND THE FOREGOING AGREED ORDER. I UNDERSTAND THAT BY SIGNING, I WAIVE CERTAIN RIGHTS. I SIGN IT VOLUNTARILY. I UNDERSTAND THIS AGREED ORDER CONTAINS THE ENTIRE AGREEMENT AND THERE IS NO OTHER AGREEMENT OF ANY KIND, VERBAL, WRITTEN OR OTHERWISE.

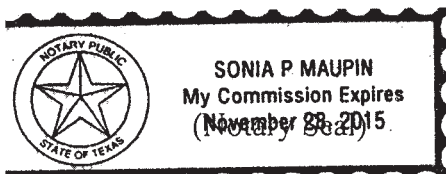


